Don Walsh served in the Navy from 1948 to 1975, mostly in submarines during his 14 years at sea. Walsh commanded a submarine from 1968- to 1970, retiring with the rank of Captain. From 1959 to 1962 he was the first commander of the Navy's Bathyscaphe Trieste and was designated U.S. Navy deep submersible pilot #1 in 1959. In 1960 he and copilot Jacques Piccard dove

Trieste into the deepest place in the World Ocean, a depth of seven miles and will share this adventure during NOHA that took place 50 years ago but has never been repeated.

Walsh's lecturing activities have taken him to 60 nations where he has given more than 1,500 lectures, TV and radio appearances. He has a BS in engineering, MS and PhD in oceanography and an MA in political science.

As an adventurer-explorer, he has worked in the deep oceans, polar regions and space

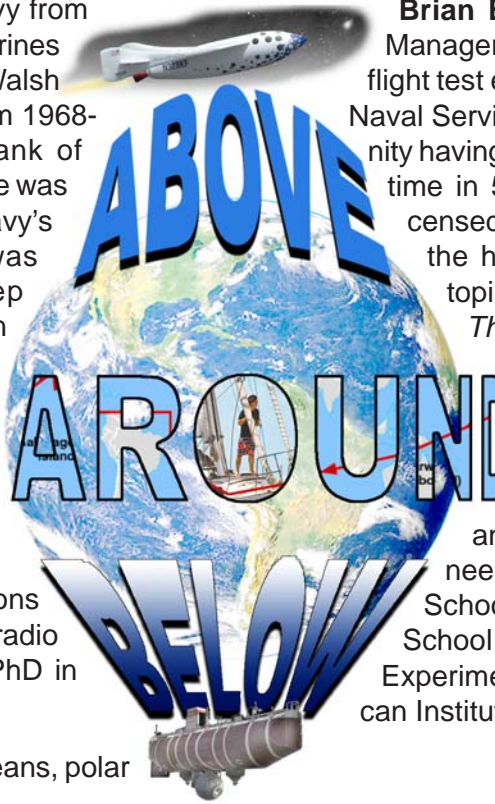
and has dived other sites such as the Titanic, the Mid-Atlantic ridge and ancient shipwrecks off Marseilles. His contributions to polar exploration were recognized in 1973 when a mountain ridge in the Antarctic was named for him.



Zac Sunderland set off at age 16 into the Pacific Ocean on a quest, not only to see the world and have the adventure of a lifetime, but to become the youngest person to sail around the world alone. More people have gone into space than have attempted a solo circumnavigation. Thirteen months later he returned completing his attempt and setting two world records: the youngest ever to sail around the world and the first under 18.

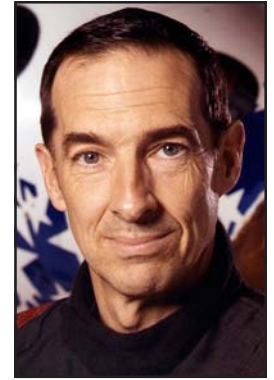
Born in 1991, where he grew up on and around the water. He learned how to sail when he was 4 years old. Prior to sailing around the world, Zac lived on Catalina Island for two years and traveled all over the world sailing in Australia, England and New Zealand before moving back to California to a house in the valley. He bought his boat *Intrepid* with his life savings of \$6500 he had earned and after three long months of work later, he was off on his 28000nm trip.

Over the next 13 months, Zac experienced rough storms, pirates, deserted islands, the loneliness of spending weeks alone at sea the adventure of learning new cultures and languages, making great friends and losing some to the sea. Zac will share his story of adventure at NOHA.



Brian Binnie is a Program Business Manager and Test Pilot. He has 21 years flight test experience including 20 years of Naval Service in the Strike-Fighter community having logged over 4600 hours of flight time in 59 different aircraft and is a licensed Airline Transport Pilot. One of the highlights of his career and the topic of his presentation is piloting *TheSpaceShipOne* over 300,000 feet into space on the first commercial manned spacecraft.

Brian's educational background includes a B.S. in Aerospace Engineering, an M.S. in Fluid Mechanics and Thermodynamics and an M.S. in Aeronautical Engineering. He is a graduate of the U.S. Navy's Test Pilot School at Patuxent River, MD and the Naval Aviation Safety School at Monterey CA. He is a member of the Society of Experimental Test Pilots and a published member of the American Institute of Aeronautics and Astronautics.
